Society Hill String Quintet

The Society Hill String Quintet, formed in 2004, is a widely acclaimed ensemble consisting of seasoned members of the famed Philadelphia Orchestra. Their repertoire is eclectic and spans a vast musical landscape from the early Baroque to the ultra modern. They are also renowned for creating arrangements specific to their ensemble. Performing throughout the Philadelphia area, the Quintet has most recently been featured in a postlude concert in Verizon Hall of the Kimmel Center. The Group was also highlighted in a special intermission feature of an internationally televised internet 2 broadcast of a Philadelphia Orchestra Concert. The group regularly performs at the Perelman Recital Hall of the Kimmel Center and on the Chamber Series at the Philadelphia Museum of Art. The Society Hill Synagogue in Center City Philadelphia, with its acoustically perfect Colonial period sanctuary, serves as home base for the ensemble concert series.
